This international seminar represents a further development in the already intense scientific exchanges between the Universities of Malmö and Paris-Est: Erasmus agreements between the Department of Urban Studies and the Paris School of Urban Planning; and the research network between the Critical Research on Urban Sustainability Hub and the Justice, Space, Discriminations, Inequalities group from the Labex Urban Futures.

The purpose of the seminar is to bring together PhD candidates working on similar research topics, but who do so using distinct theoretical and methodological approaches stemming, most importantly, from different national academic traditions.

The seminar is expected to reflect on the different approaches and methodologies and, ideally, ignite further collaborations between them, such as collective writing.

Lab'Urba hosts this first edition of an annual workshop whose purpose is to gradually create a network of young researchers.
